

WorldSkills Ukraine competition started in Ukraine

On September 29, the final of WorldSkills Ukraine Competition began in Mariupol and will take place in four other cities of the country. Metinvest Group is the general partner of the competition for the fifth time in a row.



Due to coronavirus pandemic, the number of skills was reduced from 17 to nine: electrical, welding, fitting and turning, brickwork, hairdressing, mechatronics, and railway transport operation and maintenance. Students and young workers will show their skills. For participants' safety, one day is dedicated to compete in one skill.

From September 29 to October 13, Zaporizhia, Kyiv, Dnipro and Glevakha (Kyiv region) will be picking up the baton of WorldSkills Ukraine from Mariupol. Online broadcasts of the competitions in Mariupol from September 29 to October 1 and in Zaporizhia on October 7 and 8 will be available on Metinvest's

Worldskills Ukraine is a part of Worldskills International competition, also called olympics for the students of vocational and trade schools, university students and workers aged 18-22.

The competition is organized by the Ministry of Education and Science of Ukraine, the Institute of Education Content Modernization, the Federation of Employers of Ukraine, and is supported by the Federation of Metallurgists of Ukraine and Ukrmetallurgprom association.

Worldskills International was founded in 1946. This is the largest skills competition in the world holding its events in 85 countries. Ukraine has been a member of Worldskills International since 2016.
